Message from the President of the Board of Trustees and the Director

he 2021-2022 fiscal year saw the Museum return to normal operations by the spring for the first time since March 2020. Visitors increased steadily as the year progressed, returning to attend in-person programs and events. In May we made the public announcement of the Museum's capital campaign, Reimagining The Columbus Museum, which supports comprehensive renovations and improvements to the building and grounds to ensure our Museum can be enjoyed by the community and visitors for generations to come. After five years of planning, we were delighted to share details with the community about the exciting coming improvements. The comprehensive renovation, scheduled to begin October 31, 2022, includes a more welcoming front entrance; redesign and relocation of the children's gallery, with an adjacent interactive children's garden; redesigned history galleries; visitor orientation spaces; a café; an improved garden terrace and restoration of key features of the historic Bradley Olmsted Garden; and a renovated Galleria. We anticipate that the project will be completed in spring 2024.

In 2020, the citizens of Muscogee County voted in favor of a five-year ESPLOST (Education Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax) to fund capital projects within the Muscogee County School District. As a partner of the MCSD, the Museum was the beneficiary of ESPLOST funds that supported the renovation of the collection storage vault and a new, separate workroom. With this new storage system, our growing collections can be accommodated for years to come. We are grateful to the community for supporting the ESPLOST that made this important project possible.

During the renovation of the storage vault, the Museum presented the exhibition *It Came from Storage: Canvases, Curiosities, and Other Objects from the Museum Vault*, which shed light on museum practices for acquisitions and collections care and management. *It Came from Storage* received the gold award in the poster category from the Southeast Museum Conference. It was one of six exhibitions that opened during the year; all are listed in this report. We received additional awards from the Southeasern Museums Conference, including the bronze award for the exhibition catalogue

Alma W. Thomas: Everything Is Beautiful. As the 2021-2022 year closed, the Museum prepared for the Columbus opening of Alma W. Thomas: Everything Is Beautiful, with preview receptions held at the end of June for donors, lenders, and members.

A highlight of the year was the return of school tours to pre-pandemic levels for the exhibition *Journey Toward Justice: The Civil Rights Movement in the Chattahoochee Valley.* The Museum also presented two roundtables featuring Columbus residents who had participated in the Civil Rights Movement in the 1960s and early 1970s, with one for high school students in public and private schools. Our signature program, Museum PALS (Pre-K Art and Literacy in Schools) expanded from 16 to 24 classrooms, serving approximately 500 Pre-K students each month of the school year. The Museum's partnership with the Muscogee County School District continued to bring significant opportunities to work with students, teachers, and administrators as we sought to connect them with American art and regional history in engaging and enjoyable ways.

Our many donors, members, volunteers, and community partners provided major support for the Museum's annual operations and for the *Reimagining The Columbus Museum* campaign, bringing American art and history to life for the communities of the Chattahoochee Valley. The Columbus Museum's free admission and many free programs are made possible through their generosity of time, talent, and treasure, for which we are deeply grateful.



2021–2022 Education Programs

In the 2021-2022 fiscal year, The Columbus Museum's Education Department served 11,903 people through a variety of onsite, offsite, and virtual programs. The Museum PALS (Pre-K Art & Literacy in Schools) program continued to expand, serving 24 classes in eight schools. The annual Fall Festival returned in October, welcoming visitors to enjoy outdoor art activities in a socially distanced setting. In June, summer camps also returned at full capacity, welcoming kids of all ages to explore the Museum. Adult audiences enjoyed talks and lectures cov-

ering topics such as the Civil Rights Movement in the Chattahoochee Valley, the legacy of Frederick Law Olmsted, and the Thomas-Cantey family's history in our region. Our in-person school tour program resumed, with lots of interest in tours of the exhibition *Journey Toward Justice: The Civil Rights Movement in the Chattahoochee Valley.* Five new programs were also launched this year, including a series of adult art making classes in partnership with the Housing Authority of Columbus, Georgia.


